GARY RUPP PASSED AWAY MARCH 21ST

We are deeply saddened that our Master Electrician, Gary Rupp, passed away suddenly, and unexpectedly at his home at age 63 from a massive heart attack early in the morning of March 21st.

He was doing the electrical work – and donating the many hours of his time – to make the Bunte Shop into a Palisade History Museum.



Gary was the first to arrive, ensuring the electrical work was done right.

Gary's incredible work ethic and insistence on doing the job correctly was a huge boost to the project. Among his legacies was being the master electrician everybody in Palisade wanted to have for their home and business projects.

Gary was born at St. Mary's hospital on October 22, 1956. He graduated from Palisade High School in 1975 and married a classmate and the love of his life, Gayle Watson. Gary is also survived by his parents, *(continued)*

WHAT WAS PALISADE LIKE IN 1918 FOR THE SPANISH FLU PANDEMIC?

Palisade residents lived through another pandemic in 1918 when the Spanish Flu was rampant. By searching issues from the online issues of *The Palisade Tribune* in the Colorado Historic Newspaper Collection database, you can find articles even though President Wilson's sedition act was applied to publishing information about the flu as it was thought critical of the U.S.' War efforts.

In Palisade, the schools, picture show, churches, and the pool hall were all closed for a time starting in October. The emergency hospital in Palisade closed in late December 1918, reporting four deaths out of 48 people admitted. However, in February 1919, a member of the Clark family–who was a teacher in Collbran-died two weeks after she came from Collbran to Palisade to attend a basketball game. A young man from Clifton who also attended was sick and several young people were later inflicted with the Spanish flu.

One interesting feature in the November 1, 1918 *Palisade Tribune* was a poem by a local student poet. Ramel T. Hall:

"THE SPANISH FLU WILL GET U IF U DON'T WATCH OUT!" By Ramel T. Hall, Palisade They've got it in the army camps, They've got it 'cross the sea It seizes even the old tramps That bum from you and me. It attacks our loyal soldiers, too, And the nurses are all called out. And the Spanish "flu" will get U If U don't watch out. It crept into the armies first. And then into the town. It surely is a thing accursed— And now they've shut things down. It causes grief and trouble, too, So you'd best take care, I shout, For the Spanish "flu" will get U If U don't watch out The deaths from it are countless, it snatches away our own, And leaves many a ladless lass To battle life alone. It takes the women and children, too. So watch what you're about: 'Cause the Spanish "flu" will get U' If U don't watch out.
