The Palisade Historical Society and the Palisade Branch Library Auxiliary are sponsoring a photo restoration service for Historic Preservation Month in May.

The Photo Restore Roundup will take place on Saturday, May 14, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Palisade Branch Library, 119



West Third Street in Downtown Palisade.

Restoration services will be provided by Gayle Madden, Adobe Certified in Photoshop with over 15 years experience. She is a working member of Operation Photo Rescue, an international group of professionals who help restore photos from around the world that have been damaged by disaster.

Everyone is encouraged to bring damaged or aged photos of personal or local history for professional digital restoration. Photos can be scanned while you wait and originals returned that day. You are encouraged to bring your own storage device, such as a thumb drive or CD, for the digitized photos. A \$5 donation to the Historical Society is suggested.

For photos needing extensive restoration that can't be accomplished while you wait, the restored version would be made available later as a jpg via email, or as arranged.

Palisade Loses a Favorite Historian

We are saddened by the death of Ron Jaynes, who among other accomplishments, wrote about the German Prisoners of War who lived at the CCC Camp and worked to harvest peaches during WWII. He presented stories from his manuscript at one of the Historical Society's first "Palisade Reflections" programs in October 2010. Ron interviewed people who remembered the German POWs.





Ron humbly said he just liked to "doodle," but was really a skilled artist. He created and shared a dozen illustrations in 2011 for our popular Historic Palisade Coloring Book. His prized color illustrations on a piece of Mountain Lion brand wrapping paper became the Coloring Book's front cover. On the back cover he drew a steam engine and refrigerated box cars—essential to Palisade's unique agricultural history—and an iconic orchard hoopie stacked with bushel baskets of fruit being loaded into a refrigerated box car.

This Coloring Book is now in its third printing and has reached more than a thousand elementary students and their families in Palisade and the Grand Valley.

We also miss Ron's encouraging phone calls to volunteers and answering questions about his father, Oscar Jaynes', work as the long time manager of the Peach Board of Control. Our condolences to Ron's family, especially his daughters, brother, John, and niece, Illene Roggensack.

Newly Acquired Post Cards — More details of Price and Stub ditch pumping plants

Before 1917, the Price and Stub ditches had pumping plants at the mouth of DeBeque Canyon. New photo postcards - one purchased from a collector, and one donated by Marie Granat and Margie Boucher - reveal interesting details and the size and location of the plant. When it was clear the Grand River Diversion Dam provided a more consistent supply of water to the Government Highline Canal, the Price and Stub Ditch exchanged their water rights for water from the Highline and the pumping plant was abandoned.
