Olde Fashioned Christmas

For Olde Fashioned Christmas, the Historical Society's Friday night parade entry was a 1930 Model A Ford. On Saturday Dec. 2nd we had historic photos and displays at the Palisade Library.

An Olde Fashioned Christmas highlight this year was the United Methodist Church's 120th

Anniversary of when it began services in 1897. The current church building-shown here in 1909– was built in 1907 as the Methodist Episcopal Church. It cost a little over \$14,000, and was the first property in town to have concrete sidewalks, iron hitching posts and was lighted by electricity. Colorado Governor Henry A Buchtel delivered the dedication sermon. The current pastor, Rev. Pat Lewis, delivered the re-dedication ceremony at noon on December 2.

Jack Webb passed away Nov. 15



One of our very special Lifetime Members, Jack Webb, passed away peacefully last month at his home in Grand Junction at age 91. Jack was a coal miner in Cameo and shared his

stories and memorabilia which we displayed at the Heritage Rendezvous exhibit at the Museums of Western Colorado as well as in the Cameo display case until the History Center closed. Jack assisted with information for our Coal Mining in Palisade, Colorado booklet and underwrote the cost of the publication which is dedicated to his father, Roy, also a Cameo coal miner. The booklet is used as a textbook at Palisade High School. Jack also explained maps of area coal mines, including mines near Garmesa at the Garfield County line north of Loma. The Webb family lived there before moving to Cameo and grade-school aged Jack went into the mine with his father. We were blessed to get to know Jack and preserve some of his memories in our oral and video history program.


