Cameo Historian John Klemenic Passed Away May 3

John Klemenic, local historian and expert on the history of Cameo, passed away earlier this month at age 94. His family lived in Cameo and he graduated from Palisade High School, served in the Army, and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in chemical engineering. John had careers with the Oil Shale Demonstration Plant at Anvil Points near Rifle, the U.S. Bureau of Mines, and the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission in Grand Junction. He retired after a 34 year career in government service. He then extensively researched and wrote "Cameo: Birth, Life, and Death of a Small Coal Mining Community." This book is the definitive history of the former town east of Palisade and an invaluable resource for local history. John participated in some of the early Palisade Historical Society programs on coal mining in the area.
