Elizabeth was featured last December in our "Authors, Cookies, Palisade History" event with the Palisade Branch Library Auxiliary. NEW WINDOW DISPLAY -"GARAGES OF PALISADE"

The changing window display at the History Center now features photos and memorabilia from six of more than a dozen locations in Palisade where autos were repaired over the years.

Engine repair was important to Palisade for more than cars. Though in general, vehicles were older and

needed repair, the trucks, orchard hoopies, and other vehicles for fruit growing and coal mining created even higher demand. Charlene Weidner and Ralph Branch created a window display with interesting photos and memorabilia from six garages located in Palisade including the Bower Garage, Hoffman Garage, Bennett Motors, Bennett Young's Grocery and Service Station, Palisade Garage, and Capp's Service Station/Naeve Brothers. There were six other garage locations near downtown Palisade, though not all 12 were in operation at the same time. The History Center is open Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and on Sundays during Palisade's Farmer's Market from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The revised Palisade Historic Walking Tour Brochures have been revised and are now available at several locations. It is free and distributed in brochure racks around town so visitors and locals can learn about Palisade's history on their own schedule. Before the Historical Society took on revising the brochure, the Palisade Chamber gave away thousands of a previous version. Thanks to a

generous grant from the Palisade Lions Club, the Historical Society was able to proceed. "We want to tell Palisade's history through some of its most interesting buildings," said Charlene Weidner, director of the Palisade Historical Society who spearheaded the revision. Window signs in most of the 42 locations highlighted in the revised guide facilitate self-guided tours.
