#### CCC CAMP PRESENTATION - MAY 16 AT NOON -FOR MESA COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM

The program will feature photographs from the fascinating photo album which belonged to William J. "Bill" Peska, who was stationed at our CCC Camp for almost five months-from July 17, to December 10, 1939. Others with first hand experience of the CCC Camp are invited to participate in the program which is dedicated to the late Dave Soker, a Palisade resident who was involved in the Chamber History Committee and researched Palisade's CCC and Migrant Camps.

#### COAL MINING IN PALISADE - JUNE 20 AT NOON

The Mesa County Historical Society has asked Bennett Young, Palisade native and professional geologist, to present a program about the nearly 20 coal mines in the Palisade area at the following MCHS Oral History Program on June 20. This program is also free and will be at 12 o'clock noon in the Whitman Building at the Museum of Western Colorado (4th and Ute) in Grand Junction.

Coal Mining was an integral part of Palisade's development and is often overlooked in overall Grand Valley history. In the early 1900s, coal mining was a big business and as important as fruit growing to the area's economy. Bennett's wealth of knowledge about local mines comes from exploring them as a youngster and later as a registered professional geologist working with the U.S. Bureau of Mines.
