### **“LOCAL AUTHORS, COOKIES, AND PALISADE HISTORY” SATURDAY, DECEMBER 7<sup>th</sup>**

#### ***Book Signings, Guided Walking Tours, and More!***

The Palisade Historical Society is again partnering with the Palisade Branch Library Auxiliary for the “**Local Authors, Cookies, and Palisade History**” event on **Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup>** during the **Olde Fashioned Christmas**.

The event coincides with the Auxiliary’s traditional patron appreciation open house and book sale. Everyone is invited to **visit local authors at the Palisade Branch Library** on Third Street and purchase signed copies of books from **10 a.m. – 1 p.m.** New this year, the authors will also do selected readings.

Local authors are **Patti Hill**, whose latest novel, *Goodness and Mercy* is set in Palisade during WWII, and **Terry Ragsdale**, who write the family saga, *Roots of Indifference*, and a children’s book, *A Legend of Grand Mesa*. **Anthony Prinster**, author of *The History of City Market*, and **Sherry Ficklin** and **Tyler Jolley**, authors of *Extracted*, will also be at the Local Authors event at the Library.



Also available will be *Peaches and Politics in Palisade, Colorado*, written by Palisade Native **Paul H. Bardell, Jr.** and the ***Historic Palisade Coloring Book*** with proceeds to the Palisade Historical Society.

## INAUGURAL PET PARADE -- A GREAT SUCCESS!



## NEWEST ACQUISITIONS INCLUDE WESTERN COLORADO FRUIT LABELS



Among the newest items donated to the History Center are Hugh Coachman, Jr's beautiful fruit label collection from Palisade and other Western Colorado growers and cooperatives.

In the early part of the 20th Century, intense competition among fruit growers and marketing cooperatives led to the creation of beautiful, nearly artistic, and eye-catching paper labels pasted on the end of wooden boxes to identify their brands.


With Hugh's collection, we revised the fruit label window display to include a Colorado Midland Railway iconic Mountain Lion logo which the Grand Junction Fruit Growers Association modified for their brand. Hugh also inspired us to create a video to showcase our 60+ label collection. Stop by the History Center to watch the video. It features the earliest United Fruit Growers' Association's paper label in 1923, cardboard box stenciled labels of today, as well as labels from growers in Delta County, and Cortez.

## CHANGING WINDOW DISPLAY FEATURES MEMORABILIA FROM CAMEO

The changing window display at the History Center is being transformed to a tribute to nearby Cameo, Colorado. Stanley Duncan is lending us items from his collection. Stanley's mother was postmistress of the Cameo post office located in the Cameo Mercantile Co. general store from March 1953 until Jan. 31, 1969, so several items are from the Post Office and store. The history of Cameo, which was located less than five miles



from Palisade in DeBeque Canyon, is intertwined with Palisade's history. Cameo's story has much more dramatic shifts, however. While Palisade holds on to its agriculture roots, Cameo went out of existence as a coal mining town in favor of the recently demolished, coal fired power plant.

When the display is completed, the Palisade Historical Society is planning a members-only reception with former Cameo residents and their families to gather at the History Center to browse the exhibit and share stories.

## HISTORICAL SOCIETY EXHIBIT FEATURED IN THE MUSEUM OF WESTERN COLORADO HERITAGE RENDEZVOUS

The Palisade Historical Society has been asked to participate in the Museum of Colorado's Heritage Rendezvous exhibit which features historical groups and museums on the Western Slope. John Lindstrom is preparing the exhibit to communicate Palisade's coal mining and agriculture connection.

Another benefit of the collaboration with the Museum will be Palisade Historical Society Members will receive access to all the western slope museums participating in the Heritage Rendezvous. In return, we will allow members of those museums to browse the Palisade History Center at no charge. We will have more details in upcoming newsletters for the February 14 - May 3 exhibit.

The mission of the Palisade Historical Society is to collect, preserve, and communicate the unique history of Palisade, Colorado, and to foster, encourage, stimulate, and develop public appreciation of this history.

In less than four years since we became a 501 (c) (3) non-profit in March 2010, we've accomplished a lot. Thanks to the generosity of the Colorado National Bank and our dedicated volunteers, **The History Center at 311 South Main Street** is open several hours a week with interesting displays and Palisade memorabilia. In addition to providing *The Palisade Tribune* with a popular *Historical Photo of the Week* feature, we also record oral and video histories of people who share memories of Palisade. We present historical programs, participate in local events, and provide Guided Walking Tours of Palisade. We are also planning the 100th Anniversary Celebration for the iconic Grand Valley Diversion Dam, more commonly known as the "Roller Dam," in the summer of 2015.

Thanks to generous donations from the Sunrise Rotary Club, we provide copies of the *Historic Palisade Coloring Book* to 3rd Graders at Taylor Elementary and two other elementary schools at no charge. More than 275 students and teachers were enthusiastic recipients of coloring books this past school year.

Most recently, with financial support from the Palisade Lions Club, we updated the self-guided *Palisade Historic Walking Tour* brochure with additional history, photos, and details.

In 2012, we digitized and revised the "History of Palisade" which was first compiled in 1963 for use at the Palisade Public Library.
