

A FAMILY OF PEACH QUEEN ROYALTY!

In the last 111 years of Palisade's Peach Queens, one family stands out. Though Peach Fest was altered with coronavirus restrictions, the tradition of selecting a Peach Queen and court was fortunately continued by the Palisade Chamber of Commerce.

Interestingly, this year's Peach Princess is Hadara (Haddie) Beatrice Hanna, a 4th grader at Palisade's Taylor Elementary. She is the daughter of Cayenna Hanna, owner of Spun, Studio and Yarn Shop in the historic building on 3rd Street (Stop #29 in our walking tour brochure). Haddie's grandmother is Amy Taylor Dyer, her great grandmother is Nancy Maurer Taylor, and her great-great-grandmother was Helen Swisher Maurer, who was in the 1921 Peach Queen court. Haddie's great-great aunt, Agnes Swisher, was elected by Mesa County voters as the 1909 Peach Queen.

In 1921, the Peach Queen was Juanita Strong, and the attendants included Helen Swisher, Haddie's great great grandmother.

Agnes Swisher was perhaps the Palisade Peach Queen who got the most national recognition. At age 17 in 1909, Agnes received 2,375 votes from Mesa County voters, far more than second place Stella Frank of Grand Junction who garnered 1,756 votes. In fact, Agnes was so far ahead, the last batch of Palisade votes overwhelming for her–which arrived just at the closing deadline–were not counted.

From the September 18, 1909 edition of *The Palisade Tribune*, available on-line, we learned that Agnes and her 19 maids of honor had an unusual and *(continued)* Page 1 very important task of greeting President Taft who attended the Mesa County Fair on Thursday, September 23, 1909. We believe he is the first of nine U.S. Presidents who have enjoyed fresh Palisade peaches. His visit to the Grand Valley was critically important to get approvals to build the Grand River Diversion Dam and Government Highline Canal.

The front page of the issue features Agnes' photowhich also appeared in Denver newspapers-to highlight Denver Peach Day. This event was a Colorado Midland Railroad advertising feature to promote our state to tourists-"one set who were going west for the winter and another set returning from the west where they spent the summer." It reports the unparalleled success of the crowd gathered in downtown Denver on California Street between 16th and 17th Streets where-for 3¹/₂ hourswomen gave away 18,000 fresh Palisade peaches and 17,000 cantaloupes which grown in Clifton. The crowd of enthusiastic people stood in long lines to get their delicious peaches and cantaloupe.

Denver Peach Day was also likely an event where the Colorado Midland brand – a mountain lion – had a peach inserted in its mouth to promote delicious Palisade peaches. About that time, that graphic became the familiar Mountain Lion brand for the Grand Junction Fruit Growers' Association.

NEW DIMENSIONS VIRTUAL TOUR OF PALISADE OCTOBER 8th - 1:00 P.M.


