

## HARRY TALBOTT, HISTORICAL SOCIETY FOUNDING DIRECTOR PASSES AWAY MARCH 14th

Harry C. Talbott, a founding director and officer of the Palisade Historical Society, passed away at his home after a brief illness on March 14<sup>th</sup> at age 86. Harry was a fourth-generation fruit grower and graduated from Palisade High School in 1952.

His maternal great-grandfather, Joseph Yager, was the first generation to grow fruit in Palisade coming from Iowa in 1907. Harry's mother, Margaret Yager Talbott continued the Talbott's legacy as a founder of the Child and Migrant Services which still serves Palisade's much needed seasonal agricultural workers. Harry led the transition of the family business from primarily growing and selling apples under the Western Grown label and peaches through the Mountain Lion Brand Marketing Cooperative. Now, Talbott's Mountain Gold is the largest peach producing and packing operation in the State. It also offers cider, hard cider, and wine products from a

near year-round tap room and retail sales presence in Palisade as well as the wholesale side. He also ensured its longevity by enticing his sons and several grandchildren into the business.

Harry presented the "History of Irrigation in Palisade" at an Historical Society "Palisade Reflections" program in 2012.



Another lasting accomplishment when agricultural land was being ravished in the Oil Shale boom in the 1970s, Harry and his wife of almost 63 years, Bonnie, were key players amongst the original founders of the Mesa County Land Conservancy to preserve rich agricultural land in the Grand Valley.

Harry received many honors for his farming and community involvement, including from the Western Colorado Horticultural Society as "Peach Grower of the Year" and was named an Honorary Lifetime Member. In 2018, he was inducted into the Colorado Agricultural Hall of Fame.

For the Palisade Historical Society, Harry was an invaluable resource of information and ideas. He served on the inaugural history committee and then as an officer on the Board for its first five years.

He also presented several programs, including the "History of Fruit and Wine in Palisade" for the January 2011 Western Colorado Horticulture Society (continued) Page 1

Conference which combined fruit growers and viticulturists for the first time. He also presented the "History of Irrigation in Palisade" for several audiences in addition to our Palisade Reflections program series. Recently, he led a tour of fruit processing facilities for a class we offered through the Western Colorado Community College.

The Historical Society's memorable 100<sup>th</sup> birthday event for the Grand River Diversion Dam (the "Roller Dam" in DeBeque Canyon) was a successful day-long celebration attended by 500 people on June 27, 2015. It was Harry's idea. With his wonderful – and always present, pun-loving and dry sense of humor, he proposed it would be a "Dam Birthday Party."

Harry spearheaded another inventive project to preserve Palisade's unique *Magnolia Soulangtari*. A bare-root tree was found abandoned in a boxcar of box shook – precut lumber for the wood shipping crates for peaches. It was planted on West First Street in the 1930s and thrived for decades, despite Palisade's moderately alkaline soil, cold winters, and low rainfall which are not conducive to magnolias. In 2000, scions of the tree were sent to the Gossler Farm Nursery in Oregon. The grafts were successful and cultivated as "Palisade Peach." Harry paid for several of the trees to be distributed as a fundraiser for the Historical Society.
