

"HISTORY OF FRUIT AND WINE – PART 1" DEC. 9th HISTORY TALK 6 p.m.

The first in a series of half-hour talks about Palisade history at The Ordinary Fellow Winery – 202 Peach Avenue in Palisade – is Thursday, December 9th at 6 p.m. Priscilla Walker will present information about how Palisade has produced the best-tasting peaches for over 130 years. Additional information about how Palisade also became the center of Colorado's wine industry will be presented in future history talks.



The Ordinary Fellow Winery, 202 Peach Avenue, will host monthly history talks starting December 9th at 6 p.m.

"We're thrilled by the newest Palisade winery's interest in local history," Priscilla said. "Their location is in the heart of Palisade's fruit processing and shipping facilities starting in the 1890s." Buildings on the north side of the railroad tracks in downtown Palisade included the first Palisade fruit cooperative, and for 77 years, the United Fruit Growers' Association which was formed in 1923. The Ordinary Fellow Winery building was built in 1977 after UFGA's wooden platforms in the same location burned. Peaches continued to be shipped by the UFGA from this location until 2002.

In January, Gary Hines, Historical Society Board Member, will present a history talk on irrigation which is vital to agriculture and life in the Grand Valley. Gary has a special connection to irrigation history as his grandfather was caretaker of the Grand River Diversion Dam for 33 years.

ASBESTOS ABATEMENT AT 1925 PALISADE HIGH SCHOOL



The asbestos mitigation project by the Town of Palisade for the 1925 High School has begun. The building will be removed next year in anticipation of constructing a medical clinic associated with Community Hospital. The area around the building is fenced off and the gymnasium/auditorium is closed until the work is completed.

HOW TO CORRECT OCR ERRORS IN THE DIGITAL PALISADE TRIBUNES

If you have looked at digital copies of *The Palisade Tribune* – or other historic newspapers on the Colorado Virtual Library database - you can often see differences between the scanned image on the right and the Optical Character Recognition printing on the left side of the screen. The OCR process is critical for researching by name or topic. Correcting those errors – by looking at what was printed – improves the accuracy of the searches.



The Colorado Virtual Library has come out with some new tips for how you can more easily correct errors:
