## "HISTORY OF IRRIGATION" HISTORY TALK ON JANUARY 20 at 6 p.m.

The second of the half-hour talks about Palisade history at The Ordinary Fellow Winery – 202 Peach Avenue in Palisade – is on Thursday, January 20 at 6 p.m.

Gary Hines, Historical Society Board Member, will present "The History of Irrigation in Palisade: Waters for the Valley," providing the historical perspective about irrigation which is vital to agriculture and life in the Grand Valley. The discussion will highlight successes and failures of early irrigation attempts, all of which led to today's efficient and essential irrigation systems.

Gary has a special connection to irrigation history as his grandfather Carver was caretaker of the Grand River Diversion Dam for 33 years.

### MT. LINCOLN SCHOOL BUS "PEACH SPECIAL" DRIVEN BY HARVEY BALL

Anita Spinnie and Arlene Sanders shared their wonderful Lester and Ball family albums about the Mt. Lincoln area, including the Mt. Lincoln School which was located 1 1/2 miles west of Palisade at G Road and 36 1/10 Road.


Some of the photos and newspaper clippings feature the Mt. Lincoln school bus, otherwise known as the "Peach Special."



In 1924, the Mt. Lincoln District purchased the bus to transport students to Grand Junction High School. The first driver was Anita and Arlene's father, Harvey Ball. He was also a student and graduated from Grand Junction High School in 1925.

The bus, built on a White truck chassis, was purchased by residents of the Mt. Lincoln district for \$7,800. The excessive cost of maintaining the Mt. Lincoln High School was noted as the reason for discontinuing high school classes. The previous year, students attended Palisade High School. The Mt. Lincoln School District would pay tuition fees for students attending Grand Junction High School.

The bus seated 32 people comfortably. The interior presented the appearance of a sedan, being entirely upholstered on the top, sides, and seats in rich brown leather. It had four dome lights inside and a heater for use in cold weather. All windows could be raised or lowered at will. (continued)
