THE ORDINARY FELLOW WINERY MONTHLY TALK “Downtown Palisade Center Pictorial Tour”

Thursday, Dec. 15 at 6 p.m.

The December history talk at The Ordinary Fellow winery will be Gary Hines showing “then and now” photos of the Town center. Gary normally gives guided walking tours of historic downtown Palisade. “This tour will be easier, as everyone can sit comfortably in a chair where it’s warm inside The Winery and see how downtown buildings have changed over the years,” Gary said. The Ordinary Fellow Winery, located in the former United Fruit Growers’ Association peach processing facility, is included in the pictorial history.

HISTORY MUSEUM AND OUR PROGRAMS REACHED OVER 1,288 PEOPLE THIS YEAR!

So far in 2022, 620 people have visited Palisade's first History Museum at 3740 G Road, including several groups as well as individuals and families - locals and visitors of all ages - wanting to learn about Palisade history. In addition, programs held outside the History Museum have reached another 668 people for a total of 1,288!

Of the outside number, almost 400 people attended monthly history talks at The Ordinary Fellow Winery, and our programs for local schools and Coloring Book presentations reached 227 students.

NEW HYDRO PLANT "RIBBON CUTTING" HELD NOVEMBER 30th

ADA MAXINE CLARK ALLEN PASSES AWAY IN NOVEMBER

One of our most enthusiastic supporters, and history resources was truly a role model in the agricultural industry. Maxine Lundgren Clark Allen passed away on November 17th. She was 87.

Maxine's parents and siblings moved to Palisade in 1949. She was a homecoming attendant at Palisade High School in 1950 and elected homecoming queen in 1951. She graduated in the class of 1952. Maxine was a natural beauty and modeled clothing. She was always interested in clothing and represented Beeline Fashions for nine years.

She married Larry Clark, a fourth-generation fruit grower in Palisade, and became involved in running the business and taking on leadership roles in the industry. She was a champion for farmworker rights, the peach industry, and Western Slope women, breaking a lot of glass ceilings.

Maxine was elected national president of the National Peach Partners organization in 1979. The NPP is the women's division of the National Peach Council. She also served on the executive board of directors for the National Peach Council. She was the Western Slope's only member of American Agri-Women, a national organization of about 5,000 members. Traveling around the country, she raised awareness of the challenges of growing peaches, particularly focusing on labor issues.

After her sons took over operating Clark Orchards and she was no longer as directly involved, Maxine became a successful realtor.

The Palisade Historical Society worked with the

Colorado Foundation for Agriculture to document Maxine's interesting life. They focused on her life in World War II when the Lundgrens lived in Granada, Colorado. Her father worked at Amache, the Japanese Internment Camp which provided labor for local agriculture. Later, the family moved to Palisade, where German prisoners provided labor for peach harvests in 1944 and 1945. Both were creative solutions for Colorado agriculture labor problems. Another important fact was in both Amache and Palisade, these men were treated well because they did necessary work that otherwise would not have been possible.

Maxine and her husband, Larry Allen, attended a recent Palisade history talk at The Ordinary Fellow Winery.
