

THE ORDINARY FELLOW WINERY HISTORY TALK -Bob Silbernagel Thursday, September 7th - 6 p.m.

Bob Silbernagel will talk about Palisade's Jim Ferguson, the Wild Bunch associate who served briefly as Town Marshal and is part of a chapter in Bob's forthcoming book. Jim came to Palisade and is not related to any of the Ferguson family that moved here later. Jim Ferguson was not just a Palisade resident and soon-to-be businessman in the early 1900s, he was a peripheral member of the Wild Bunch which supplied horses and provided a hiding place for the Tipton train robbers. He was briefly Palisade's Town Marshal from March to September 1905.

The history talk will begin at 6 p.m. on Thursday, September 7 at the Ordinary Fellow Winery - 202 Peach Avenue in Palisade and Le Snack Fine Foods will have food available for purchase at 4:00 p.m.

Next month's history talk - Dave Fishell "The Perplexing Plunder of the Palisade Post Office" Thursday, October 5th 6 p.m.

His roots and love of Western Colorado were evident as he explained how counties were divided by how far a horse could be ridden in a day, and why towns were established next to rivers. His view of the evolution and consolidation of newspapers is the good ones will still be successful.

Bob also talked about the importance of supporting non-profits which are essential to accomplish what government cannot do to take care of people.

ATOMIC LEGACY CABIN CELEBRATES 80 YEARS

On March 23, 1943, 2nd Lieutenant Philip C. Leathy arrived in Grand Junction to procure as much uranium as possible for the Manhattan Project. In 1946, the Atomic Energy Act was signed which established the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission. The Department of Energy established the longterm surveillance and maintenance program in Grand Junction.
