#### "Celebrating 80 Years of Legacy on the Colorado Plateau" Thursday, December 14<sup>th</sup> 6 p.m.

For the December history talk, Ashton Peterhans, Interpretive Specialist and Contractor for the U.S. Department of Energy Office of Legacy Management, will explain how uranium changed Grand Junction at a critical time in the nation's history.
