"Then and Now" - Orchard Mesa Irrigation District History by Jackie Fisher, General Manager THURSDAY, MARCH 21st - 6pm

The March history talk will be on Thursday, the 21st at 6 pm at the Ordinary Fellow Winery. Jackie Fisher, general manager of the Orchard Mesa Irrigation District will present the interesting history of the OMID which was formed in 1907 and began pumping irrigation water in 1910. In 2022, it replaced its 1933 hydro plant with its new Vinelands Power Plant.

### LAST MONTH'S TALK Curtis Martin - "Bright Beads and

Rusted Relics: Innovative Archaeology on a 19<sup>th</sup> Century Ute Indian Site"

The February history talk program was Curtis Martin, principal investigator for the Wickiup Project and author of *Ephemeral Bounty: Wickiups, Trade Goods and the Final Years of the Autonomous Ute* published in 2016.

His talk explained how returning to previously known Native American sites with metal detectors they discovered glass beads and metal tweezers, knives, and ammunition as evidence the Spaniards were in Western Colorado in the mid-1800s including at the McMillen Archaeological site near Delta.

#### **120 YEAR AGO COLUMN**

For decades, one of the most popular columns in *The Palisade Tribune* was the "It Happened Here" page where the editors would summarize news of interest from issues in the past.

#### Palisade was incorporated in 1904

In as much as Palisade was formally incorporated as Palisade in April 1904 – making the Town officially 120 years old this year – we found some interesting articles about the Town's founding.

#### From the March 5, 1904 issue:

The incorporation committee presented the petition of forty property owners and qualified electors to the county judge yesterday asking that he call an election of the qualified electors in the proposed limits of the town of Palisade for the purpose of voting on the proposition of incorporation. The committee secured the names of all who were asked to sign the petition with the exception of four or five. That the proposition will carry goes without saying.

### Another article in that issue piqued our interest about some of the motivation for incorporating:

The gentleman who is thinking of erecting a \$20,000 brick hotel in Palisade says he will have to see the town incorporated before he will do so.

We surmised the "gentleman" was Lige Jordan who had begun the process of creating the two-story brick hotel and office building he was planning to build on the corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Main Street. The Jordan Inn opened in 1908, and unfortunately, burned to the ground in November 1915, forever changing downtown Palisade.

Mandatory election notices were published on March 12<sup>th</sup> as well as March 19<sup>th</sup>, and April 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Election was held May 2, 1904. The Notice included the following excerpts from those issues:

#### **Notice of Election**

In the Matter of the Incorporation of the Town of Palisade. Notice is Hereby Given, that under and by virtue of the order of the county court of Mesa county, Colorado, made and entered of record on the 7th day of March, A. D. 1904, the same being a regular juridical day of the March 1904 term of said court the undersigned were appointed as commissioners to call an election of all the qualified electors residing within the territory proposed to be embraced within the limits of the town of Palisade as hereinafter described and in pursuance of the petition filed in the county court of said county on said 7th day of March, 1904. Therefore, public notice is hereby given that an election of all the qualified electors residing within the territory described in said petition, and hereinafter set forth, will be held at Bancroft & Reed's real estate office in the town of Palisade, in the county of Mesa and state of Colorado, on the 4th day of April A.D. 1904, between the hours of ten o'clock and six o'clock of said day...

#### PALISADE NATIVE JERRY NISBET PASSED AWAY JANUARY 10

Palisade native Jerry Nisbet, son of George and Rena Nisbet, was born November 8, 1924. He graduated from Palisade High School in the class of 1942 and served in the Army in Europe during World War II. He earned a Ph.D. in Biology from Purdue and worked at Ball State University in Indiana for 33 years as a professor and chairman of the Biology Department.

Jerry and his wife, Janice Hampton, also a Palisade native and daughter of Kermit and Eulalah Hampton, PHS class of 1946, moved back to Palisade in 1983. She passed away in 2017. Jerry shared several

photos with the Historical Society, including photos of the Town's water system improvements in the 1940s. His father was the Town Manager from 1935 until he retired in 1972.


