



MAY HISTORY TALK THURSDAY, MAY 9TH - Leigh Jeremias "Reading Yesterday's News Online Today"

On May 9th at 6 p.m. at The Ordinary Fellow Winery, Leigh Jeremias from the Colorado State Library will show key website features and tricks for searching the Colorado Historic Newspaper Collection which now includes 3,753 issues of *The Palisade Tribune*, This important community history is often not included in any other source for students, teachers, genealogists and general researchers.

April 2024 LAST MONTH'S TALK "Then and Now" - Orchard Mesa Irrigation District History by Jackie Fisher, General Manager

The March History Talk speaker was Jackie Fisher, general manager of the Orchard Mesa Irrigation District who presented the interesting history of the OMID which was formed in 1907 and began pumping irrigation water in 1910. OMID also replaced its 1933 hydropower plant with its new Vinelands Power Plant in 2022. Her talk explained the challenges of operating a 100+ year old pumping plant, water rights, and how the more efficient Power Plant uses the same amount of water to generate more power.

120 YEAR AGO COLUMN

For decades, one of the most popular columns in *The Palisade Tribune* was the "It Happened Here" page where the editors would summarize news of interest from issues in the past.

Palisade was incorporated in 1904

Realizing our town was formally incorporated as Palisade 120 years ago this month, we found some interesting articles about the Town's founding in the 3,753 archival issues.on the CHNC database.

From *The Palisade Tribune* April 9, 1904 issue:

Palisade Incorporates.

The election held last Monday to vote on the proposition of incorporating the town passed off in a good-natured manner. A great deal of friendly rivalry was displayed by those on opposite sides of the proposition. After the ballots had been counted it was found that there were eighty-three for incorporation and thirty-six against. The vounger generation and those who had worked for the proposition had guite a celebration in the evening at which time canon crackers and anvils were fired, and the air was shot full of holes with roman candles and sky-rockets. The next thing now in order will be the electing of a mayor, four trustees, a treasurer, and a clerk. The convention for nominating the same will, no doubt, be held next week. Those who are opposed to licensing a saloon will then have their say in the matter. It is the opinion of lhe editor that it would be best to have "for" or "against" saloons placed on the ballots, and that all candidates be pledged to abide by the will of the people, in this regard.

Following the successful incorporation vote, the next step was to nominate candidates for mayor and trustees. The other item on the ballot for the May 2nd election was whether or not Saloon Licenses should be approved. The two parties nominating candidates were the Citizens Party and the Republican Party.

From The Palisade Tribune, April 23, 1904

"The Citizens Ticket."

Tuesday evening, as stated by the polices posted about town, a mass meeting of the qualified electors of the town of Palisade was held in Bowers' Hall for the purpose of placing in nomination one mayor and six trustees, to be voted on at the municipal election to be held May 2nd. Dr. Brown called the meeting to order and H-W. Kluge was nominated as temporary chairman and Fred Bower its temporary secretary. The next thing in order was the nomination of candidates, which after the ballots were counted, resulted as follows: For mayor, H. W. Kluge; for trustees, W. A. Powell, D. M. Landreth. Dr. G. R. Brown, J. S. Marlin, C. Bower and W. E. Bell. Upon motion it was decided to place, "For Saloon License" and "Against Saloon License" upon the ballot and that every voter be given a chance to exercise their opinion in this matter by their ballot, and also that all candidates accepting, a place on this ticket be pledged to abide by the decision of the majority of the voters. It was decided to call this set of nominees "The Citizens Ticket." F. M Gould was elected permanent chairman of the party and Fred Bower permanent secretary. Before closing Mayor-to-be Kluge was called upon for a speech, to which he responded to in his usual happy manner. During his remarks he stated a number of plain facts and also that he would, if elected, do his best to look after the welfare of our prosperous little town. He was followed by a number of short talks from those nominated as trustees and other citizens.

From The Palisade Tribune, April 30, 1904 The Republican candidates on the May 2 ballot were F.J.Songer for Mayor, and for trustees; H.D. Sayles, J.A. Pearson and Geo. W. Sawade. The ballot also gave voters of both parties the choice of: For Saloon License or Against Saloon License.
