On June 13th at 6 p.m. at The Ordinary Fellow Winery, Andrea Lopez, who leads Ute Water's

Affairs External Department. will talk about the history of the Ute Water Conservancy District. It was formed April 4, 1956, and just celebrated its 68th birthday! It supplies domestic water service to the rural areas of the Grand Valley. Its service boundaries encompass



approximately 260 square miles in Mesa County including areas around Palisade not served by the Palisade Municipal Water system.

These History Talks are open to the public at The Ordinary Fellow Winery, 202 Peach Avenue. It is a relaxed and comfortable setting to learn about Palisade's unique history and enjoy a glass of wine. The tasting room opens at noon.

JULY HISTORY TALK THURSDAY, JULY 11th - 6pm "THE HISTORY OF THE PALISADE INSECTARY"

On July 11th, Director Dan Bean will present the history of the Department of Agriculture's unique Palisade Insectary. It started in 1945 to control the Oriental Fruit Moth, a devastating pest of peaches. The insectary continues to distribute beneficial insects for use against invasive weeds. The insectary also monitors and provides assistance to continue the fight against invasive Japanese Beetles which thrive on peaches, grapes and roses and were successfully eradicated from Palisade several years ago.

June 2024 LAST MONTH'S TALK "Reading Yesterday's News Online Today" by Leigh Jeremias

The May History Talk was Leigh Jeremias, Digital Collections Senior Colorado Consultant at the Colorado State Library. She showed tips and tricks for searching the Colorado Historical Newspaper Collection website. Currently there are 3,753 issues of *The Palisade Tribune* on the database of 4.4 million pages from 762 titles of Colorado newspapers! This important community history is often not recorded in any other source for students, teachers, genealogists and general researchers.


2nd Grade Teacher, Beth Graham, and her class' coloring book display in the hall - The orchards are blooming!

NEW SIGN AT PIONEER MONUMENT

There is a new sign commemorating the Pioneer Monument at I-70 Exit 47 near Cameo. In June of 1931, the stone roadside marker was dedicated to "The Pioneers of the Mountains and Valleys of Western Colorado" and to the construction of 14 miles of new roadway extending from the mouth of Plateau Canyon to DeBeque. More than 30 years later, it was moved to its current location to make room for I-70 and the exit to US Highway 65. The Plateau Valley Historical Preservation Society worked with the Colorado Department of Highways to create and place an interpretive sign with the monument's history. An official dedication will be later this year.

The PVHPS is also planning to replace missing bronze plaques from the Pioneer Monument.

AT CMU:

Tasalyn Anderson Love, a history student at Colorado Mesa University, created an exhibition (pictured on the left) that features the history of the Palisade Peach and the peaches wav are embedded in the local culture. Amona the photos are "Roller the Dam" which provides vital irrigation water to the vineyards and fruit orchards in Palisade. the CCC Camp

which also housed German Prisoners of War in 1944, and the Migrant Labor Camp that operated from 1941-1961, as well as Danny Bracken, the first certified organic grape grower in Palisade, and more.

AT THE CLIFTON LIBRARY:

Ramana Konantz, Adjunct Professor at Colorado Mesa University, and Librarian at the new Clifton

branch library on D ½ Road, embraced our offer of historic photos of Clifton. She ordered frames and incorporated 14 photos for the initial rotating display which began May 10 and will continue through July 3. The photos highlight Clifton's forgotten history when it was a stop for the Mountaineer passenger train in the 1950s, and a fruit processing hub for the Mountain Lion brand marketing cooperative. J. W. Hugus and Company's 12th store and bank was in Clifton in the early 20th Century.


