Leading up to celebration of the United States marking the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and Colorado marking the 150th anniversary of our entrance into the Union in 1876, the Palisade Historical Society's November history talk will be local award-winning archaeologist Curtis Martin who will tell us what the world was like for folks living in the state and working and building vibrant lives in the Grand Valley and elsewhere in 1876.

The talk will begin at 6 pm on Thursday, Nov. 13th at The Ordinary Fellow Winery. This program is open to the public in a relaxed and comfortable

The Palisade Historical Society's December history talk will be presented by Patrick Steele, Palisade High School Science Teacher / Fish Hatchery Manager / Football Coach; and Mike Gross, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service-Fish Culturist / Outreach Coordinator, along with former graduates of Palisade High School who are currently working with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.




More than a decade ago, an ambitious vision took root at Palisade High School (PHS): to build a

student-operated fish hatchery dedicated to the conservation of endangered native fish of the Colorado River. That vision became reality in 2015 through a partnership with the Upper Colorado River Endangered Fish Recovery Program. But the true origins of this story trace back millions of years, to the evolutionary journey of the razorback sucker — a rare species now nurtured by students in the heart of Palisade.

The talk will begin at 6 p.m. at the Ordinary Fellow Winery, 202 Peach Avenue in Palisade.

#### **COLORADO RIVER - LOW AUGUST 11**

With the higher diversion for the Grand Valley Canal, the Colorado River was often entirely diverted into the canal near Riverbend Park The lowest water level for the summer was on August 22 when the River was even lower at 3.24 feet than this photo taken when the official measurement near Cameo was 3.84 cubic feet per second. After the record setting rains in October it was at 3.92 cubic feet per second.
