JANUARY'S HISTORY TALK IRIANA MEDINA FROM CMS TO LA PLAZA

January's History Talk will be Thursday, January 8th at 6 p.m. at the Palisade Community Gym, 711 Iowa Avenue. Iriana Medina, Executive Director of La Plaza, will talk about the evolution of Palisade's Child and Migrant Center to its current vision which empowers the immigrant community in the Grand Valley through education, leadership opportunities, and initiatives that promote self sufficiency and equity.

JANUARY'S HISTORY TALK IRIANA MEDINA FROM CMS TO LA PLAZA (CONT.)

Child and Migrant Services (CMS) began in 1954 when local fruit growers' wives, Vera Foss, Margaret Talbott, and Dorothy Powers joined forces to improve the living conditions of the migrant seasonal farm workers and their families in Mesa



County. The current name reflects the change of bringing the community together to face complex

challenges in a central gathering space – or La Plaza.

The talk will begin at 6 p.m. on Thursday, January 8 at the Palisade Community Gym (711 lowa Ave). Admission is free, and donations are appreciated. Food & beverages will not be sold on site, but people are welcome to bring their own.

LAST MONTH'S HISTORY TALK

Our December History Talk about the Palisade High School Fish Hatchery was presented by Mike Gross, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Fish Culturist/Outreach Coordinator *(below)*, along with Kiera Stephen, Annie Barnes, & Kale Potter - PHS graduates, now college students, who work seasonally with the USFWS.

Now in the fifth year of operation, over 1,250 endangered razorback suckers cultured at the PHS Fish Hatchery have been successfully released into the Colorado River. The students initially raised \$30,000 through various fundraising & community donations to up-grade an old storage building on campus for the hatchery. PHS has received national accolades for this project!




